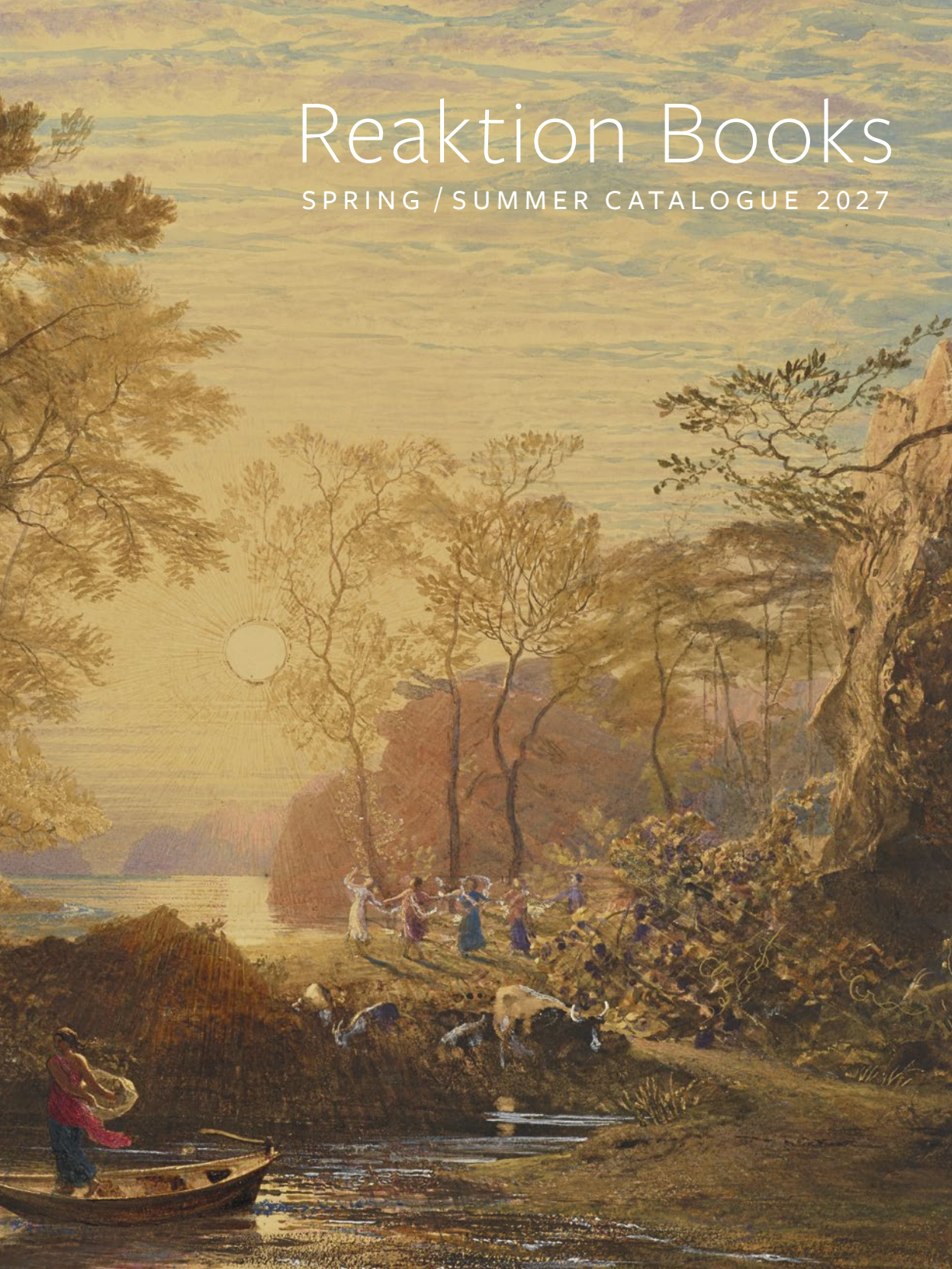
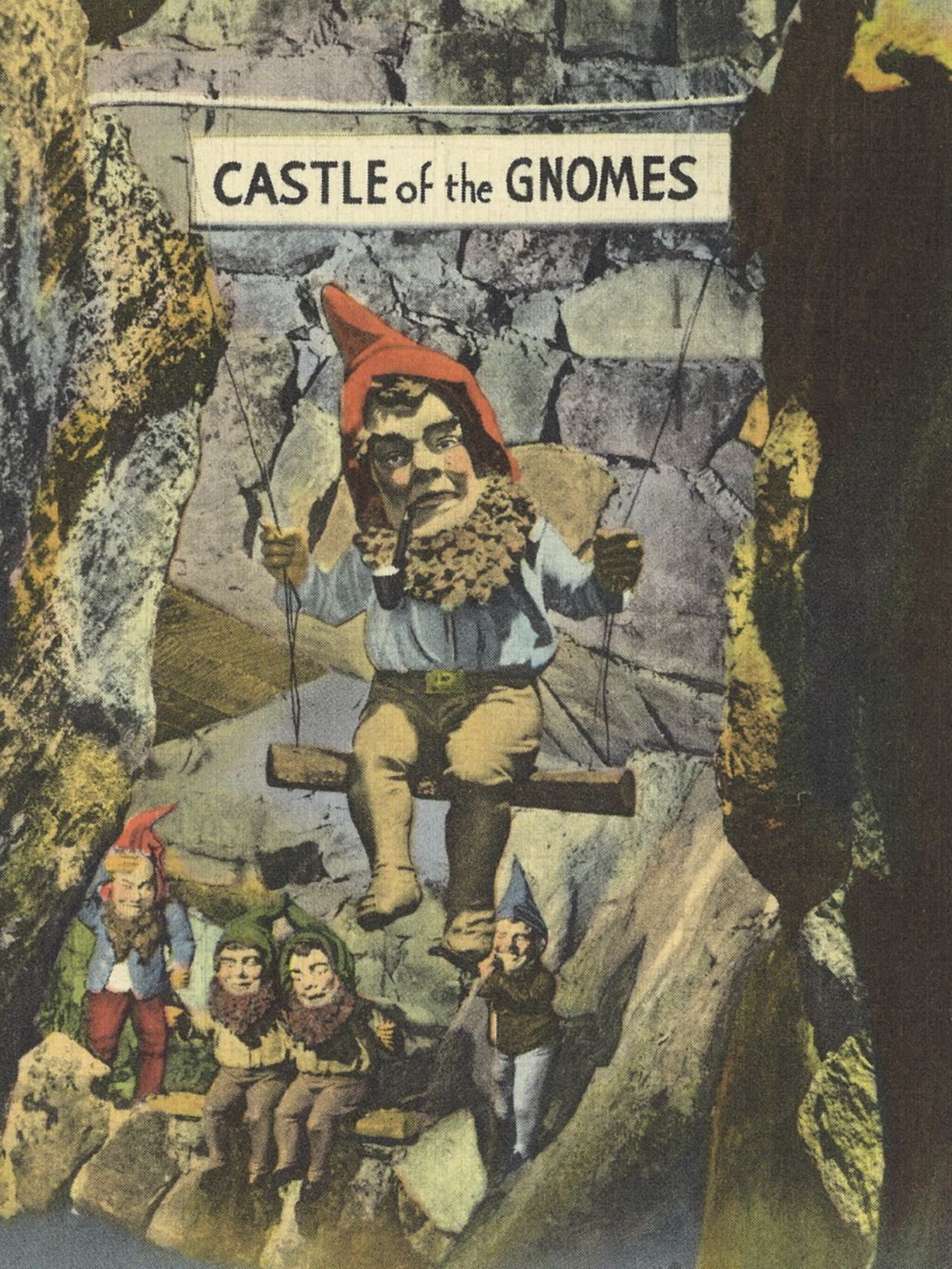

Conceived as a companion to *Chromophobia*, David Batchelor turns from colour as an abstract idea to the histories, associations and contradictions of individual colours. Across chapters devoted to reds, yellows, blues, greens, blacks, whites and greys, he draws on an extraordinary range of artists, writers, philosophers, architects and musicians to show how colour has been understood, celebrated, feared and contested. Written with clarity and insight by an artist whose own work is rooted in colour, this book argues that no colour possesses a fixed meaning and that every claim about colour can be challenged by another. In doing so, David Batchelor invites readers to reconsider their own perceptions and the limits of language itself.

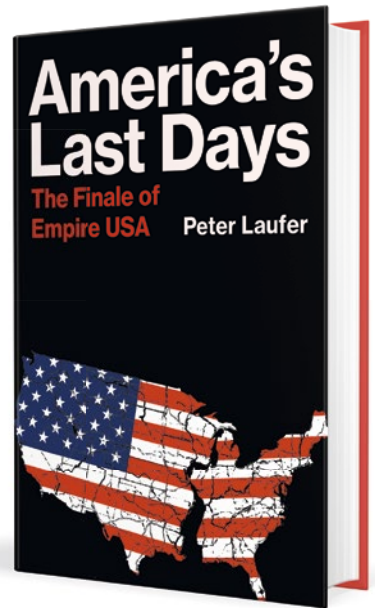
America's Last Days

As the United States moves beyond its 250th anniversary, questions about national identity, political cohesion and the future of the republic have become increasingly urgent. *America's Last Days* argues that the tensions present since the nation's founding have deepened into a profound crisis of unity. Tracing the historical forces that shaped the United States, Peter Laufer examines contemporary divisions rooted in politics, economics, culture, immigration and regional identity. Drawing on primary sources and original reporting, this book considers secession movements, border realignment proposals and growing challenges to the idea of a shared American project. Provocative and wide-ranging, it asks whether the United States can endure in its current form, or whether a different political future may emerge from its longstanding divisions.

Peter Laufer is a former award-winning correspondent for NBC News and holds the inaugural James Wallace Chair in Journalism at the University of Oregon. His books include *Up Against the Wall* (2020) and *We Are All Americans* (2026).

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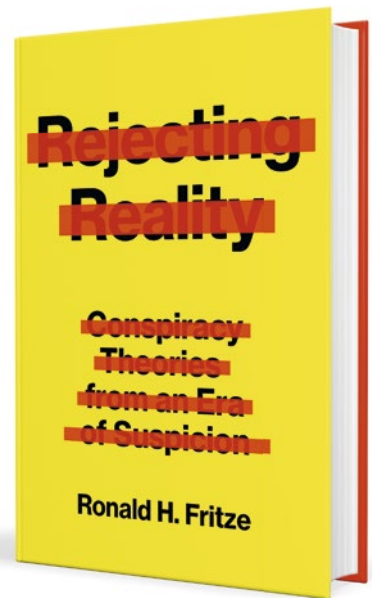
Rejecting Reality

Conspiracy Theories from an Era of Suspicion

Ronald H. Fritze

Conspiracy theories have long shaped public debate, but how do they originate and why do they persist? *Rejecting Reality* traces the origins and evolution of four of the most influential conspiracy theories of recent decades: anti-vaccination movements, QAnon, UFOs and claims surrounding COVID-19. Using historical case studies, the book shows how these ideas emerged, adapted and spread, with proponents often drawing from questionable assumptions that governments and institutions are engaged in deception. Ronald H. Fritze examines the appeal of such narratives while assessing their credibility and consequences and how they promote scepticism, distrust and division in general society. Clear-eyed and engaging, *Rejecting Reality* encourages readers to apply the same critical scrutiny to conspiracy theories that they apply to official claims, highlighting the importance of evidence in public life.

Ronald H. Fritze is Professor Emeritus of History and Religion at Athens State University, Alabama. He is the author or editor of twelve books, including *Hope and Fear: Modern Myths, Conspiracy Theories and Pseudo-History* (Reaktion, 2022).

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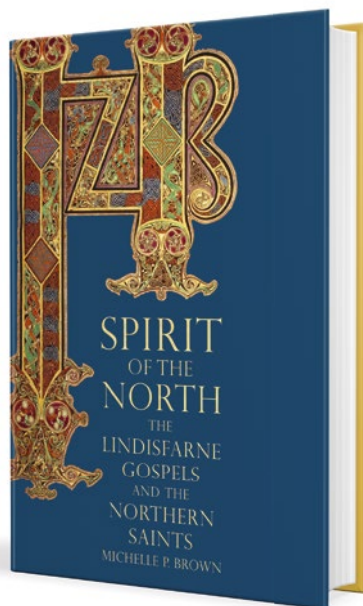

Druidlands

A Pilgrimage to a Sacred Past

Miranda Aldhouse-Green

The Druids – mystical, spiritual leaders of Britain and Europe during the last centuries BC – are a people shrouded in mystery. Miranda Aldhouse-Green's *Druidlands* is an illuminating, thrilling guidebook that throws light on this most enigmatic, arcane caste.

Druids flourished as the theocrats of their day – employing sacrifice, shamanism and magic – until the Romans forced them underground, condemning them as hostile religious insurrectionists who threatened the conquerors' supremacy. But Druidism endured: traditions were preserved, while in subtle ways, new composite beliefs were carved out alongside Roman paganism. Drawing on classical literary sources and a wealth of archaeological material, much of it recently unearthed, *Druidlands* points to a rich and complex native religion in the heartlands of Britain and Gaul.

Miranda Aldhouse-Green is Emeritus Professor of Archaeology at Cardiff University and a former president of the Prehistoric Society. She has published more than twenty books on Iron Age and Romano-British religion and ritual, including *Sacred Britannia* (2023) and *Bog Bodies Uncovered* (2016), winner of the Archaeological Institute of America's Felicia Holton Book Award.

The Wicked Witch

Origins of an Enduring Worldwide Belief

Gregory Forth

Few figures haunt the human imagination like the witch. While existing books and media have largely focused on the trials of Early Modern Europe and America, far less explored is the enduring global belief that certain people secretly wield destructive supernatural powers. Drawing on the author's own field of research and a wealth of cross-cultural evidence, this book examines how societies across the world imagine witches in strikingly similar ways: flying by night, shapeshifting into animals, inverting ordinary behaviour and committing horrifying acts – ritual murder, cannibalism, the abuse of children. By tracing these recurring ideas across vastly different cultures, the book uncovers remarkable patterns in human thought, fear and other emotions, and it asks why such concepts persist, pointing to deep social and psychological roots in human evolution.

Gregory Forth is Professor Emeritus of Anthropology at the University of Alberta. His books include *Between Ape and Human: An Anthropologist on the Trail of a Hidden Hominoid* (2022) and *A Dog Pissing at the Edge of a Path: Animal Metaphors in an Eastern Indonesian Society* (2019).

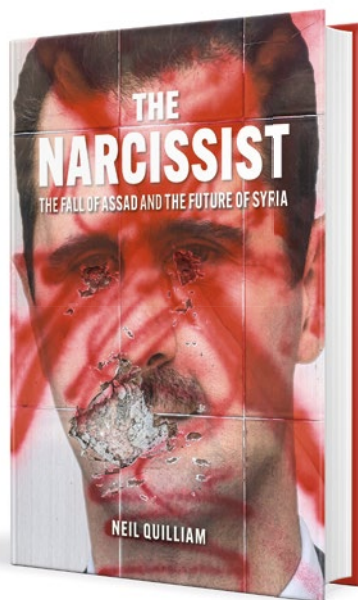
The Fall of Assad and the Future of Syria

Neil Quilliam

The Narcissist tells the story of a quiet ophthalmology student who never expected to rule his country. Neil Quilliam traces Bashar al-Assad's upbringing as the overlooked and uncertain son in a family of hard-edged power brokers, showing how these early experiences fed a deep sense of inadequacy and a need for validation. Over time, these traits found expression in the authorization of chemical weapons, the use of industrial torture and the systematic killing of his own people. More than two years after Bashar's dramatic flight to Moscow, the world is only now beginning to reckon with his regime's legacy and Syria's future.

Drawing on behavioural psychology, psychoanalytic theory, newly uncovered documents and interviews with those who knew him, Quilliam argues that the Syrian conflict cannot be understood through institutional or geopolitical explanations alone. It was the man, not the machine, that destroyed Syria.

Neil Quilliam is an Associate Fellow at Chatham House, London. He is a geopolitics, foreign affairs and energy policy specialist, with extensive knowledge and experience of the Middle East.

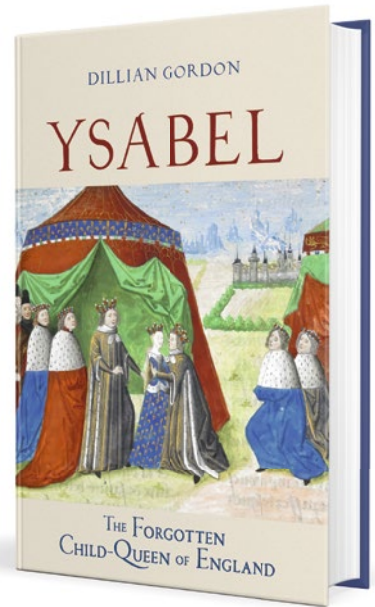

Ysabel of Valois' life was shaped by power, diplomacy and tragedy. As the eldest daughter of King Charles VI of France, she was married at six years old to Richard II, king of England, bringing her dolls in her trousseau to a foreign land. A political pawn throughout her life, she was virtually held hostage by Henry IV following Richard's deposition and death, and after her return to France she was married off to Charles, Duke of Orléans.

This first independent biography of Ysabel places her remarkable story within the wider context of the French and English medieval courts, revealing the politics, ceremonies and material culture that framed her life.

Dillian Gordon was previously Curator of Early Italian Paintings at the National Gallery, London. She has published widely on Italian medieval and Renaissance paintings, as well as on the Wilton Diptych. She lives in Oxford.

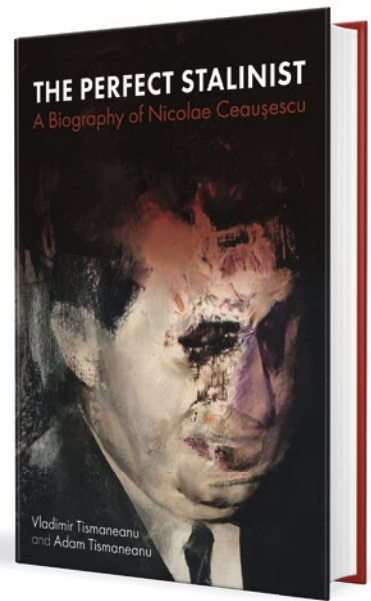

This is the most comprehensive English-language biography of Romanian communist dictator Nicolae Ceaușescu. Based on unique archival materials, in-depth interviews and personal memoirs, *The Perfect Stalinist* tells the story of Ceaușescu’s rule and rise to power, from his youth in the interwar Romanian communist underground and his role as a loyal protégé of Gheorghe Gheorghiu-Dej to his eventual succession in 1965 and execution during the Romanian Revolution of 1989.

During his 24-year rule, Ceaușescu created a self-styled form of dynastic communism based on his all-encompassing cult of personality. His brand of extremist nationalism remains influential today among personalities like Peter Thiel, Alexander Dugin and other neoreactionaries. Ceaușescu’s story of delusional narcissism and its destructive effects is sure to resonate with observers of contemporary politics.

Vladimir Tismaneanu is Professor of Comparative Politics and Director of the Center for the Study of Post-Communist Societies at the University of Maryland, College Park. He is the co-author of *Communism and Culture* (2022). Adam Tismaneanu is a writer, journalist and independent researcher. His work has appeared in various outlets including *Newsweek România* and *POLITICO Europe*.

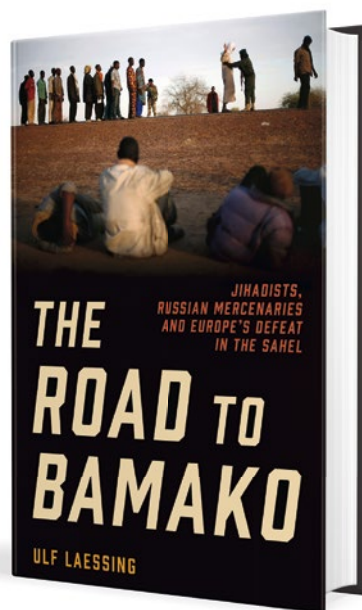

The Sahel region, from Mauritania in the West to Sudan in the East, is in crisis. 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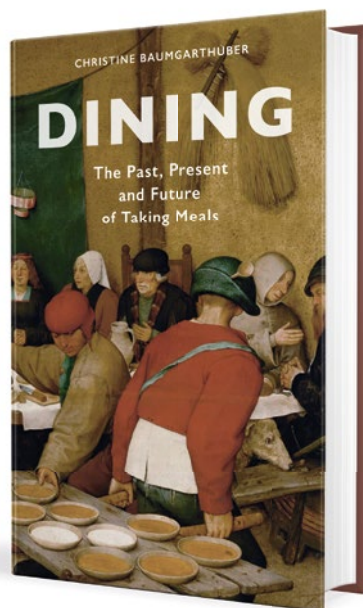

This first full-scale history traces its path from vitamin pioneers, organic farmers and dietary reformers to today's wellness industry and debates over nutrition, sustainability and public policy. It reveals a movement marked by striking contradictions: science and romanticism, innovation and quackery, individual choice and collective change. Lively, wide-ranging and deeply relevant, it shows how everyday food choices became a powerful force in shaping modern society.

Gregory A. Barton is Professor of History at Western Sydney University and Visiting Professor in the Department of History at the University of Johannesburg. 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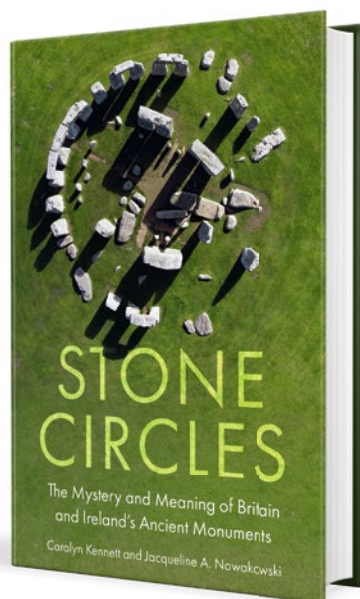

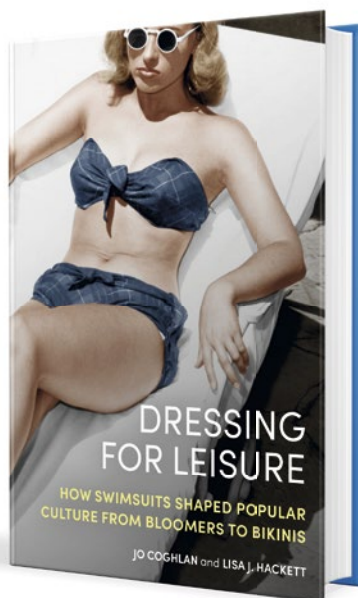

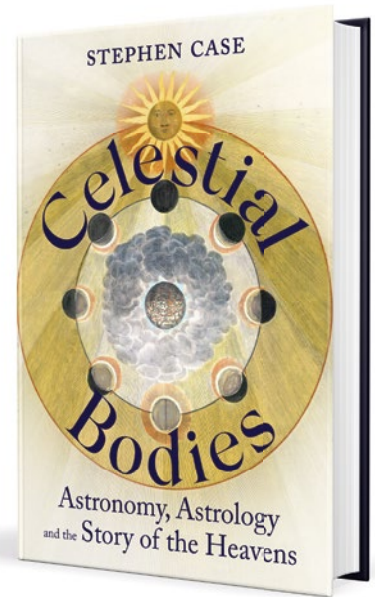

Celestial Bodies offers a jargon-free history of astronomy and its relationship with astrology. For most of human history, the study of celestial bodies and their earthly influence was not distinguished. Although the Scientific Revolution of the seventeenth century sounded the death knell for astrology, many prominent early scientists took it seriously, casting horoscopes while conducting scientific experiments. The notion that celestial influence could be ‘mapped’ onto human lives only slowly became a fringe belief.

Stephen Case deftly explores how astrology transformed from a primary motivation to study astronomy to the pseudo-science that it is today. Only by understanding astrology’s role in astronomy’s development can we fully come to understand the complete story of humanity’s relationship with the stars.

Stephen Case is Professor in the Department of Chemistry and Geosciences at Olivet Nazarene University in Illinois. His books include *Creatures of Reason: John Herschel and the Invention of Science* (2024).

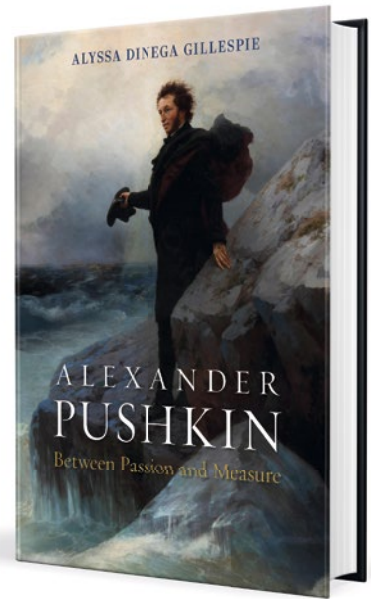

Alexander Pushkin (1799–1837) was the founder of the modern Russian literary tradition and the first to fully develop Russian as an expressive literary language. Passionately and irrepressibly creative, he lived under the constraints of imperial censorship and repeatedly clashed with the Tsarist regime. This biography traces the dramatic events of Pushkin's life while revealing the personal and psychological forces that shaped his work, from the wounds of childhood and his evolving political sympathies to his intense emotional life and uncompromising sense of honour. Drawing on the latest scholarship, Alyssa Dinega Gillespie challenges the sanitized, official 'Pushkin myth' in Russian culture and offers a more complex portrait of the poet. At its heart is the story of a writer whose pursuit of inner freedom transformed Russian literature and continues to resonate today.

Alyssa Dinega Gillespie is a prize-winning translator and scholar of Russian and Ukrainian literature, the editor of *Taboo Pushkin: Topics, Texts, Interpretations* (2012) and translator of *Vega's Fugitive: Poems by Marina Tsvetaeva* (2026). She lives in Brunswick, Maine.

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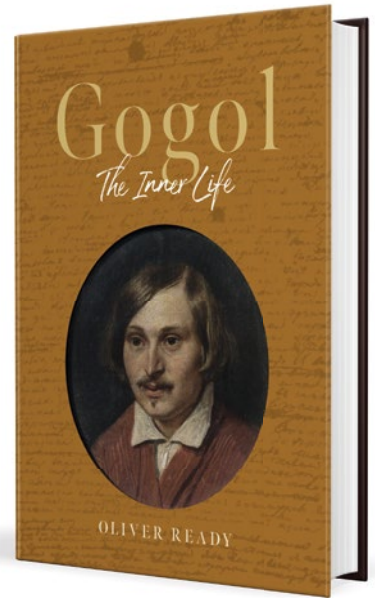

Nikolai Gogol (1809–1852) was one of the most original and elusive writers of the nineteenth century: a comic genius, a master of the grotesque and a restless traveller whose life crossed the cultural worlds of Ukraine, Russia and Europe. In this first comprehensive account of Gogol's life and work in a generation, Oliver Ready draws on the latest scholarship, as well as his own translations of Gogol's fiction, to present a concise yet richly nuanced portrait. Moving beyond familiar myths and stereotypes, he portrays a figure shaped by competing loyalties, spiritual longings, creative ambition and periods of profound inner struggle. Muhammad xī of Granada, better known as Boabdil, was the last ruler of Muslim Granada and one of the most consequential figures in the history of medieval Iberia. This biography traces his turbulent life, following his struggles for power, family rivalries, the fall of Granada in 1492 and his final years in exile. It places his life within a world transformed by religious conflict, political consolidation and the emergence of Spain as a global power. Drawing on sources in multiple languages, the book separates history from centuries of legend while examining how Muhammad xī's memory has been reimaged across the world. More than the story of a defeated king, it is an account of how history is remembered, reshaped and contested across generations.

Frederik Cryns is Professor of Japanese History at the International Research Center for Japanese Studies, Kyoto. He is the author of *In the Service of the Shogun* (Reaktion, 2024) and served as historical consultant to the Emmy-winning television series *Shōgun* (2024).
